<u>Massachusetts Division of Marine Fisheries Report:</u> Ross Kessler attended the meeting and gave the following report:

PUBLIC ACCESS

- · Over the past winter I worked with the Trustees of Reservations (TTOR) on a Beach Management Plan (BMP) for the Edgartown reserve That work with TTOR is done. A BMP will be released sometime this fall. TTOR needs to write it up.
- · In the meantime, TTOR has a pending Notice of Intent (NOI). This NOI passed the Edgartown Con Com last week and Orders of Conditions are pending. In the meantime, the beach is open for ORV and foot access.

Striped Bass- The division manages a number of projects that encourage volunteer participation. These are grass roots projects that help DMF manage our fisheries. Our longstanding Sportfish Angler Data Collection Team or SADCT has anglers collect length data and fish scales for our age and growth lab. This is a very involved process with many options. If any member has a specific question, please direct it to ross.kessler@mass.gov and it will be addressed.

Other activities in the invertebrate program include:

- · The Vent less survey will continue this summer.
- · A pilot suction sampling for young of the year lobsters will take place this May in Cape Cod Bay. Suction sampling in this zone was discontinued as there is a large presence of white sharks there at the historic time of year when sampling took place. Suction sampling is done with SCUBA.
- · Commercial sea sampling or the 'Fisheries Dependent Survey' will recommence this summer in all regions.
- · DMF will continue to monitor dissolved oxygen (DO) in Cape Cod Bay in areas effected by low DO in prior years.
- · Temperature monitors will once again be replaced throughout the waters of the Commonwealth.
- · There are volunteer opportunities doing horseshoe crab surveys on many south coast and cape beaches starting in May and ending at the end of June. These surveys take place on and around new and full moons. This is a great opportunity for youth considering a career in marine biology. It also appeals to many who just like to be involved in the natural cycles we live around. Contact derek.perry@mass.gov for more information or to volunteer.

Androgynous- All runs currently have herring. Return numbers will be calculated in the coming months.

The Stump Brook, part of the Taunton R. watershed, fish way is scheduled to be installed this August.

Below is a representation of how many fish ways projects the Diadronous project has completed and how many acres of spawning habitat have been returned to androgynous fish populations through them.

<u>Massachusetts Division of Fisheries & Wildlife Report:</u> Jason Zimmer was unable to attend the meeting but submitted the following report:

SEWD April 2023 Report

- Trout stocking continues without any issues. We expect to finish up our Spring stocking the first week of May.
- ●Two prescribed fires were completed the week of April 16th in the western woodland units at Frances A Crane WMA.
- •Herring have begun to show at Red Brook and our fisheries biologist has been completing routine visits to the herring ladder at White Island Pond and monitoring the entire stretch of Red Brook through the WMA and making adjustments as needed to facilitate fish passage.
- •Numerous visits have been made to Bird and Ram Island to complete habitat work and prep the islands for the return of nesting terns and other waterbirds. Further, experimental common eider nesting shelters have been built by SE District staff and deployed on both islands.
- •An eider nesting survey, in cooperation with the Buzzards Bay Coalition is planned for May on Cuttyhunk and Penikese Islands.
- ●Annual breeding surveys for woodcock, ruffed grouse and waterfowl will be completed in the next few weeks (some have already been completed). A common night jar survey will also be completed.
- •Spring turkey season is upon us! Mass Wildlife again hosted the youth turkey hunt at Camp Edwards with a total of 8 youth hunters participating and harvesting a total of 7 birds. The regular controlled spring turkey hunt on Camp Edwards will be held May 1-6. We will also be hosting the first ever Fall turkey hunt at Camp Edwards in October!
- •Beaver issues continue to arise throughout the District. Staff are working with Towns and residents to inform them of the applicable laws and regulations and options for remedying beaver issues.
- The annual Soaring Eagle count was completed and we monitored a total of 19 nesting locations documenting confirmed incubation and/or nest building at 16 sites.
- ●Mass Wildlife is hosting a series of WMA Cleanup events throughout the State. In the Southeast we will be hosting a cleanup at the SE MA Bioreserve on May 7th. Please see the following link for more information and spread the word to your

A discussion was held on efforts to restore American Chest nut tree groves.

Annual Banquet: By now the banquet is in the history books. It was well attended, the caterer did a great job, there were many raffle prizes won and everyone appeared to have an enjoyable evening. More details in next Months report.
